


SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Feast of St. Francis

PRESIDER: He is the name of the Three-in-One and One-in-Three. Amen.

Most high, omnipotent, good Lord, grant your people grace to renounce gladly the vanities of this world; that, following the way of blessed Francis, we may, for love of you, delight in your whole creation with perfectness of joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord,

LAY ASSISTANT: Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of God and one another, in gratitude to hear the holy Word and share in the spiritual communion of Christ. In this celebration of Christ's love, let us prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship God, and entrust ourselves to the divine mercy.

Silence is kept. Then all pray together, led by Lay Assistant:

Most merciful God,

we confess that we have sinned against you, against one another, and against our Mother Earth.

Although you have made us incarnations of your Love,

we have not reflected your Divine Image in the world.

Although you have called us to intimacy in Christ, we have shunned you in ourselves, in others, and in your Creation.

we have preferred our slavery to our passions, greed, and complacency.

Turn to us Lord, even when our hearts turn away from you.

Forgive us for the harm we cause to the innocent, the vulnerable, the voiceless.

Forgive us for the harm we inflict on the very planet that sustains us.

Instill in us a spirit of repentance.

Shake us from our complacency.

Move us to act in accordance with your Will for the love of the planet and one another.

Awaken in us the hope of the Resurrection, that recalling your boundless love for us we may love boundlessly in return.

We ask this in the name of Christ Jesus. Amen.

Their young ones become strong, they grow up in the open;

they go forth, and do not return to them.

It scorns the tumult of the city; it does not hear the shouts of the driver.

LECTOR: A reading from The Letter of Paul to the Romans [12:9-21]

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be arrogant but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay, says the Lord." Instead, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink, for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good.

Glory to you Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth,

From The Patrician Texts from the Book of Armagh, 670AD

Presider: Our God is the God of all, The God of heaven and Earth. The God of the sea and rivers, The God of the sun and moon, The God of all the heavenly bodies, The God of the lofty mountains, The God of the lowly valleys. God is above the heavens: And beneath the heavens. Heaven and Earth and sea, And everything that is in them, Such is the abode of the Holy One. God inspires all things, gives life to all things, stands above all things, and stands beneath all things. God enlightens the light of the sun, strengthens the light of the night and the stars, makes wells in the arid land and dry islands in the sea, and places the stars in the service of the greater lights.

God has a Son who is co-eternal and similar in all respects;
And neither is the Son younger than the Father,
Nor is the Father older than the Son;
And the Holy Spirit breathes in them.
And the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are inseparable. Amen.


GENERAL THANKSGIVING
