



For with you is the fountain of life, in your light we see pure light.



Hear what the Spirit is saying. All: Thanks be to God!



John: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John. (15:1-8)

(All) Glory to you, Lord Christ.

John: Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.

Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


May the hallowing of your name echo throughout the universe!

So I gaze upon you in the temple to see your strength and your glóry; * for your love is better than life, my /lips will spéak your praise.



On my bed I rem**é**mber you, * on you I muse through the night, for /you have b**é**en my help.




In the shadow of your wings I rej**ó**ice; *

Sensing his presence and his mystery,






